**1 STATION 1: City**

Parks and open space in Issaquah is integral to the City's identity as a city of valley, mountains and lakes. A healthy city integrates where people are living and working with a variety of park sizes, scales and types with ways to get around – bus, park 'n ride, future light rail, walking, and biking. As the City grows these parks play key roles in how people will use the downtown, how people will live and work in the Central Issaquah area and how people will connect to parks and open space resources that are underused today.

The parks strategic plan vision from the community is to create an emerald necklace of connected parks, trails and open spaces. These City-wide maps show how parks and open spaces of different scales, activities and playfields are distributed through the City.





### 1 TIBBETTS VALLEY PARK:



- Transit center proximity contributes to regional access to the park.
- Limited pedestrian and bicycle access along SR 900 to the park.
- Few pedestrian crossings to the park along Newport Way.
- Generally, auto-focused entrances into the park.
- Existing parking areas are an asset.
- Limited directional signage into the park.
- Limited intra-park pedestrian access to Tibbetts Manor.

### 2 VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK + DEPOT PARK + PEDESTRIAN PLAZA:



- Transit access within walking distance along E Sunset Way.
- Limited pedestrian and bicycle connections between the park, Rainier Trail, and nearby street network.
- Potential over-flow parking capacity in the large parking lots to the southwest of the park.
- Parking shared along Front St. by the city and local businesses.
- Opportunities to establish flexible curbside management.
- Challenged auto-circulation into the park due to dead-ends and one-ways streets.

### 3 ISSAQUAH CREEK CORRIDOR:




- Opportunity for a pedestrian trail along the Issaquah Creek.
- Opportunity to connect the creek trail to the existing trail network at: Squak Valley Park, the Rainier Trail and 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave SE, NW Alder Pl., Confluence Park, NW Juniper St., NW Gilman Blvd., Emily Darst Park, and SE 56<sup>th</sup> St.
- Challenges to create a continuous, multimodal, all ages and abilities trail along the creek include: environmentally critical areas, challenging topography, and funding.
- Limited connections to parking areas along the creek trail.
- Opportunity to create a pedestrian loop between the City's Front St. parcel, nearby parks, and the community center.
- Opportunity for a trail crossing study at I-90.




